Carl Gustav Carus (1789-1869)--court physician to the king of Saxony--was a naturalist, amateur painter, and theoretician of landscape painting whose *Nine Letters on Landscape Painting* is an important document of early German romanticism and an elegant appeal for the integration of art and science. Carus was inspired by and had contacts with the greatest German intellectuals of his day. Carus prefaced his work with a letter from

his correspondence with Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, who was his primary mentor in both science and art. His writings also reflect, however, the influence of the German natural philosopher Friedrich Wilhelm Joseph Schelling, especially Schelling's notion of a world soul, and the writings of the naturalist and explorer Alexander von Humboldt. Carus played a role in the revolution in landscape painting taking place in Saxony around Caspar David Friedrich. The first edition appears here in English for the first time.

For the past 140 years, Germany has been the central power in continental Europe. Twenty-five years ago a new German state came into being. How much do we really understand this new Germany, and how do its people understand themselves? Neil MacGregor argues that, uniquely for any European country, no coherent, overarching narrative of Germany's history can be constructed, for in Germany both geography and history have always been unstable. Its frontiers have constantly shifted. Königsberg, home to the greatest German philosopher, Immanuel Kant, is now Kaliningrad, Russia; Strasbourg, in whose cathedral Wolfgang von Goethe, Germany's greatest writer, discovered the distinctiveness of his country's art and history, now lies within the borders of France. For most of the five hundred years

covered by this book Germany has been composed of many separate political units, each with a distinct history. And any comfortable national story Germans might have told themselves before 1914 was destroyed by the events of the following thirty years. Auf diese Weise kamen hinzu: das Havel-Luch, Oranienburg, Tegel, Fahrland, die Fahrlander Chronik, Sakrow, „Wer war er?“, Falkenrehde, „Zwei

heimlich Enthauptete“ und Wust, das Geburtsdorf Hans Hermanns von Katte. Daran schließt sich noch Kloster Chorin, das, wiewohl außerhalb des Flußgebietes der Havel gelegen, um Lehnins willen, dessen Tochterkloster es war, mit herangezogen wurde. Wobei zugleich der Wunsch mitwirkte, dem mehrere Kapitel umfassenden Abschnitt von der Kolonisation der Mark durch die Zisterzienser wenigstens annähernd einen Abschluß zu geben. Das Historische (im Gegensatz zu „Oderland“) tritt im ganzen genommen in diesem dritten Bande zurück, und Landschaft und Genre prävalieren. paar Beispiele zu geben: das Friedrichsche Ehepaar auf der Pfaueninsel ist gestorben, Etzin ist niedergebrannt und der in Trümmern liegende Teil der Lehniner Klosterkirche ist neu aufgebaut worden. Ich hab' es aber mit Rücksicht darauf, daß alles Umarbeiten und Hinzufügen in der Regel nur Schwerfälligkeiten schafft, schließlich doch vorgezogen, das Meiste so zu belassen, wie sich's etwa um's Jahr 1870 dem Auge präsentierte und bitte den Leser, wo sich die Benötigung dazu herausstellen sollte, dies freundlichst im Auge behalten zu wollen. *Deutsche rundschau ...* J.
