The poems of MY LITTLE BOOK OF EXILES sift through layers of diaspora and return, wrestling with the twin experiences of exile and separation. The diasporas of the collection take place in history, family, and the privacy of a mind as it navigates its daily work. The collection concludes with poems exploring the homeland of family made through marriage and fatherhood, the strains and moments of

The book's strands weave a tapestry of hope even as the poems seek to discover finally what lasts.
