No sé si llamarlo de ese modo pero el libro es como un tratado. Intenté que fuera comprensivo de manera que quien lo lea entienda el qué, el porqué y el cómo de la madera. El primer capítulo es una reseña histórica que pone al lector en conocimiento de cómo empezó, se desarrolló y llegó hasta nuestros días la construcción en madera y por qué lo que se hace hoy se hace así, porque fue un desarrollo constante. El segundo capítulo lista y explica los materiales derivados de la madera conocidos hoy, es decir cómo se transforma la madera, en principio piezas aserradas, en materiales más complejos y eficientes a través del aporte de la ingeniería y la tecnología. El capítulo 3 desarrolla las características físicas y químicas de la madera y su estructura para de ello derivar su comportamiento mecánico y frente a los medios agresivos del entorno, para a su vez derivar las ventajas y desventajas que permiten definir cuándo debe usarse y en qué condiciones y cuando no. El capítulo 4 trata de la normativa vigente y como hacer un análisis racional de qué usar en cada contexto en particular. El capítulo 5 trata sobre viviendas de madera, los sistemas constructivos disponibles, su diseño y su cálculo. El capítulo 6 trata sobre estructuras de grandes luces (aquellas donde el peso propio suele ser la sollicitación preponderante), cómo encarar la decisión del uso de madera y en qué circunstancias, las distintas topologías disponibles y cómo elegir las. El diseño de la estructura y su cálculo y verificación, sobre todo aquellas que se deben realizar debido a las peculiares características del material

madera. El capítulo 7 trata sobre uniones y medios de unión, es decir como diseñar y calcular las conexiones entre piezas de madera para transmitir los esfuerzos de una a otra con seguridad. Cuenta con abundantes ejemplos y una sección del resultado de encarar en forma errónea el diseño. El capítulo 8 trata de una falla típica de la madera, las fisuras y como tratarlas. Dada la conexión que tiene con el tema se desarrolla el estudio de perforaciones y entalladuras, sus efectos y como mantenerlos bajo control. El capítulo 9 y el siguiente el 10 los dediqué al estudio de los que llamo situaciones extremas. Es decir, sollicitaciones que no son cotidianas pero que pueden presentarse como grandes tormentas, terremotos y fuego. Cómo se comporta la madera frente a ellos y cómo hacer un diseño adecuado para enfrentar tales circunstancias. Finalmente el capítulo 11 está dedicado al hasta ahora último y más moderno desarrollo de los materiales derivados de la madera, el CLT que ha permitido atravesar una frontera hasta hace poco infranqueable para la madera, la construcción de edificios en altura. En este capítulo describo el material y cómo se comporta y luego, cómo se diseña y calcula una estructura en CLT.

Zarathustra was Nietzsche's masterpiece, the first comprehensive statement of his mature philosophy, and the introduction of his influential and well-known (and misunderstood) ideas including the "overman" or "superman" and the "will to power." It is also the source of Nietzsche's famous (and much misconstrued) statement that "God is dead." Though this is essentially a work of philosophy, it is also a masterpiece of literature, a cross between prose and poetry. A considerable part

and parcel of Nietzsche's genius is his ability to make his language dance, and this is what becomes extraordinarily difficult to translate. It has been almost 40 years since Hollingdale's version for Penguin and almost 50 since Kaufmann's. However, anyone who appreciates the German original knows that these translations are merely adequate. While earlier translators have smoothed out the rough edges, cut corners and sometimes omitted troublesome passages outright, this one honors and respects the original as no other. Kaufmann and others are guilty of the deplorable tendency to "improve" on the original. Much is lost by this means, to say nothing of the interior rhythms, the grace notes, the not always graceful but omnipresent and striking puns and wordplays. And in not a few instances the current translation improves on Kaufmann's use of English or otherwise clarifies what Nietzsche is really saying
